- 1. CALL TO ORDER. The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM
- 2. ROLL CALL.

- 3. Kristen Lee is a new commissioner representing District I.
- 4. PUBLIC COMMENTS. Becky Steinbruner asked about who would be responsible for erosion control at the Aptos Village construction site; Staff will ask and respond to her.
- 5. PUBLIC PROPOSAL PRESENTATIONS. The following groups made presentations:
 - A. Classroom Aquarium Education Program (CAEP)/Trout in the Classroom (TIC)- Santa Cruz-Monterey Bay Area Student Subunit of the American Fisheries Society
 - B. Scott Creek Habitat Education and Trash Removal for Wildlife Protection- Save Our Shores
 - C. Transportation for Ocean Stewards- O'Neill Sea Odyssey
 - D. Conservation Outreach Program- Santa Cruz Predatory Bird Research Group, Long Marine Laboratory
 - E. Understanding Scott's Creek Hydrology- Cal Poly Corporation
 - F. Exploring the San Lorenzo River- Santa Cruz Museum of Natural History and Coastal Watershed Council
 - G. Marine Science After-School Program- Pinniped Cognition and Sensory Systems Laboratory, UCSC Institute of Marine Sciences
 - H. Sempervirens Watershed Curriculum Development- Exploring New Horizons
 - I. Salmon and Trout Education Program (STEP)- Monterey Bay Salmon and Trout Project

The other four groups and proposals are expected to give presentations in December: Big Basin Nature Museum and Research Center Exhibits, Larval Fish Exhibit; Native Animal Rescue; California Marine Sanctuary Foundation and CDFW/Ivy Removal.

- 6. APPROVAL OF MINUTES. Commissioner Johnson made a motion to approve the September 7, 2017 minutes with one correction. Commissioner Baron seconded the motion. All aye, the motion passed.
- 7. BUSINESS MATTERS
 - A. <u>Discuss paying for indirect costs for Public Grants Program.</u> The commission discussed paying indirect costs. It was decided to consider a 10% indirect cost allowance.
 - B. <u>Report on Cannabis Cultivation Ordinance draft EIR comments</u>. Commissioners Berry and Robin put together a strong letter that commented on a range of important issues.
 - C. <u>Report on joint meeting with Commission on the Environment and Water Advisory</u> <u>Commission and discuss Climate Change priorities for FWAC</u>. Several commissioners attended the September joint meeting. Each commission is expected to set their Climate Change priorities. Coho salmon and at-risk landscapes are possible FWAC priorities that will be discussed further at later meetings.
 - D. <u>Update on Environmental Code Compliance</u>. Staff reported that Matt Johnston is the new manager for Planning Code Compliance. The Code Compliance Roundtable will meet again in January 2018.
