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Meeting Minutes February 4, 2021

1. **CALL TO ORDER** – 7:00 pm
2. **ROLL CALL**
 - Present: Commissioners Berry, Morrow, Baron, Somerton, Alter, Jankovitz, Wise, Buchwald, Gómez, Michelsen

 - Guest Introductions: Edward Browne, District Attorney; Steve Schindler, Lieutenant, CDFW; Sean Cochran, Fisheries Biologist, CDFW
3. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** – Commissioner Somerton made a motion to approve the minutes; Commissioner Buchwald seconded the motion. All aye, the minutes were approved.
4. **PUBLIC COMMENTS.** None.
5. **District Attorney Report.** Over the past year, the District Attorney's office has completed about 10-15 civil settlements. Through one of the settlements, a pole camera was purchased for California Dept of Fish and Wildlife to assist with enforcement. The pole camera can be mounted to utility poles and used for remote surveillance, such as in dumping cases. CDFW expects that other local agencies could borrow the camera. Mr. Browne reported that most cases become civil cases, instead of criminal cases. In this case, the defendants appreciated the opportunity to purchase this useful piece of equipment for CDFW.
6. **Report and Discussion: CDFW Low-Flow Fishing Closures.** Sean Cochran, Regional Fishery Biologist, presented information on the status of low-flow closures for the San Lorenzo and other Santa Cruz County streams. A general low-flow closure is listed in the regulations but has not been specified. Sean reviewed the work that has been completed by Region 3 to propose low-flow fishing closures for the San Lorenzo River, including fieldwork and a conclusion that low-flow closures could be justified at either 40 or 70 cfs. While the BOS wrote to the Fish and Game Commission, no action will be taken unless supported and proposed by the Fisheries Branch of CDFW. There was fishing community push back against low-flow closures in the Russian and Gualala Rivers, but San Lorenzo has smaller fishing community and substantial outreach effort was made already and in general, the local fishing community supported the low-flow closures. Low-flow closures combined with shifting the fishing season would be the best solution to reduce hazard to fish during December and reduce fishing days lost to low-flow closures.
7. **2021 Work Plan.** The work plan is intended to provide focus for the limited time that the commission has to consider items during their 7 meeting per year. The work plan is also intended to encourage commissioners to research and follow issues outside of the meeting time. Staff will put together a draft work plan that incorporates how the Regional Conservation Investment Strategy (RCIS) could include items of interest.
8. **Discuss possible action to comment on UCSC long-range plan EIR and use of groundwater that could affect San Lorenzo Lagoon.** Chair Berry provided information about this process; no action was taken. Comments are due March 8, 2021.
9. **Review and discuss draft biennial report.** Commissioners made several suggestions that staff will incorporate into the report.

10. **CZU Lightning Complex Fire.** The commission received a staff report on current post-fire issues, including the toxic runoff control program and progress with cleaning up structure debris.
11. **Discuss salmonella outbreak among songbirds.** The public is encouraged to remove bird feeders to reduce spread of salmonella among songbirds.

14. **Commissioner Reports and Announcements.** Commissioner Gómez was concerned that flares, used for car accidents, were not getting properly cleaned up and disposed of. She contacted the responsible agencies to ensure compliance and is investigating how flammable flares might be replaced with reusable, non-flammable LED devices.
