IV. EHS Staff Report (Fillmore):

- EHS is still looking to fill the EHS Director position.
- Rebecca Supplee has been assigned Interim Program Manager for Hazardous Materials. The permanent position is open and applications are being accepted until 1/27/17.
- The Hazardous Materials program is preparing for the CUPA evaluation by CalEPA. The CUPA evaluation takes place every 3 years. CalEPA for the first time will be primarily conducting the review electronically.
- Inspectors are now conducting hazardous material inspections of facilities on tablets in the field.
 Inspection reports are emailed to the facilities.
- Most facilities in the County have submitted their Hazardous Materials Business Plans (HMBP) online through CERS (California Environmental Reporting System) There are approximately 50 facilities in the County that have not submitted their HMBP electronically.
- EHS would like to work with the various Fire Agencies to assist them with accessing this information on CERS.

VI. Review 2016 HMAC Goals and Set List for 2017

- Members reviewed the 2016 Goals. There was discussion to update goal number 1, so that is reads: "Ensure the continued implementation of the required electronic reporting of Hazardous Materials Business Plans (HMBP') in the California Environmental Reporting System (CERS). Also, ensure that all Fire Agencies in the county have access to the HMBP's in CERS.
- There was also discussion and agreement to delete goal number 4 "Track level II hazardous
 materials response capabilities and track the kinds of incident and problems that may arise out the
 MOU's implementation."
